

Igor Miholjek is an underwater archaeologist and a professional diver working for the Croatian Conservation Institute (<http://www.h-r-z.hr/en/index.php/zavod/about-the-institute>) since 2005, and since 2007 as the Head of the Department for Underwater Archaeology.

His primary interest is protective underwater archaeology, as well as *in situ* protection of underwater heritage from various periods of time. The most important project he supervised is the research of the post medieval shipwreck on the island of Mljet, the *Sveti Pavao* shipwreck, dating to the 16th century. Other projects involve cooperation with foreign colleagues and experts, e.g. on research projects on ship construction at the island of Ilovik, an archaeological prospection and a virtual archaeology on the submerged Roman architecture on Vižula in Istria, as well as numerous other projects involving *in situ* protection. He is the author of numerous papers on underwater archaeology, and a co-author of several books and exhibitions.
